

Accountability Committee – Directions from the Governing Council
(approved by the GC, Oct 10, 2007)

Committee Membership :

The committee chairperson will be a GC member appointed by the GC. Up to three GC members may serve on the Accountability Comm. The School Administrator and one teacher should be on the committee. Enough school parents should be members to bring the total committee membership up to seven individuals.

The committee membership will be approved by the GC in accordance with the GC ByLaws Section 9.

Unless extended by the GC, the committee dissolves at the end of the school year.

Services the Council wishes the Accountability Comm. to render :

1. Produce a report listing the elements in the CVCS Charter where the school is not in compliance, or where the committee believes that school is failing in meeting the spirit or intent of elements in the charter.
2. The committee chairperson will submit to the GC a plan whereby certain members of the Accountability Committee (approved by the Council) will examine various school documentation with the intention of measuring compliance with Statutes of the State of New Mexico and with various NM PED regulations.

Approximate dates on which the Council wishes to receive major reports:

1. Written report on CVCS compliance with the CVCS Charter – December GC Meeting
2. One or more reports, written or verbal, at several GC Meetings between January or February and the end of the school year.

All recommendations of the Acct. Comm. must be submitted to the GC for action. The GC may choose to conduct one or more special GC meeting with the CVCS Administrator to review the Charter Accountability Report. The GC and the Administrator will discuss and plan changes that may be made to correct reported non-compliance with the charter.
